

Yubari City Bankruptcy


Yubari City is the only city in Japan, which went bankrupt with a debt of 60 billion yen (AUD 700 million).












Failure of tourism industry in Yubari

Tokyo Metropolitan Government dispatched 2 staff members to Yubari City in 2007.





Up till 2016, more than 10 staff members have been dispatched to the city and more than 50 staff members have visited Yubari for training.
