

UTS Prize Conditions of Award

Outstanding Student Award for Undergraduate Students

Faculty of Arts & Social Sciences

This document sets out the conditions of award for the Outstanding Student Award for Undergraduate Students and the obligations of recipients ('Recipient') and UTS in regards to this Prize. The administrative processes to support awarding this Prize will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

1. PRIZE TITLE/NAME:

Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences Outstanding Student Award for Undergraduate Students

2. PURPOSE

To reward undergraduate students who achieve consistently outstanding results in their discipline area or major.

3. VALUE AND BENEFIT

3.1 Number of Recipients:

- One recipient from each discipline area or major will be awarded the Prize.
- Two candidates of equal merit may be recommended for a joint award of the Outstanding Student Award for Undergraduate Students.

3.2 Benefit/s to Recipient:

The prize includes a transcribed certificate, presented to the Recipient at the FASS prize giving night.

3.3 Payment of benefit/s:

4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for the Prize, a candidate must meet all of the following criteria:

- Must be a full or part time student in any undergraduate (excluding honours) degree offered by the School of Communication, School of Education or School of International Studies in Faculty of Arts & Social Sciences.
- Have graduated from UTS Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences. Student graduated with combined International Studies Degree and combined Communication Degrees are also eligible for this prize (refer to Notes in the end of document).
- Students in Diploma of Languages are also eligible for the prize.

5. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA:

- The prize will be awarded to the student who has been ranked as outstanding on their academic achievement across all graded subjects in their discipline area or major.
- Students in the School of Communication will be eligible for the prize in both of their majors.
- For students in Bachelor of Global Studies, a calculation of their Global Studies core subjects will determine the winner.
- For students in a combined International Studies degree, a calculation of their country majors will determine the winner.

6. SELECTION

- Students with an overall WAM of 85 or above in all graded subjects in their discipline area or major
- School Teaching and Learning Committee will recommend the winner based on the highest WAM for each discipline or major
- Head of School and/or the Dean or their delegate to approve the recommendation

7. OTHER CONDITIONS
