

UTS Prize Conditions of Award GroupM Prize for Global Communication Studies

Faculty: Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences

This document sets out the conditions of award for the below prize ('Prize') and the obligations of recipients ('Recipient') and UTS in regards to this Prize. The administrative processes to support awarding this Prize will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

1. PRIZE NAME: GroupM Prize for Global Communication Studies

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of the Prize is to recognise outstanding academic performance of a student in the Bachelor of Global Studies program who completed the Communication Major (MAJ10019) as part of their degree program.

3. VALUE AND BENEFIT

3.1 Number of Recipients:

Usually One (1) recipient will be awarded the prize at the end of each academic year for the highest overall grade point average in the Communication Major (MAJ10019).

3.2 Benefit/s to Recipient:

- The value of the Prize to the Recipient is \$1,000.
- The Recipient will also receive a certificate of award.

3.3 Payment of benefit/s:

- The Recipient will receive one payment of \$1,000 by electronic funds transfer to his/her nominated bank account.
- A certificate of award will be presented to the Recipient at the Annual Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences Prize Event

4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The Recipient must:

- be enrolled in the Bachelor of Global Studies; and
- have received results in all subjects within the Communication Major (MAJ10019) and Core Global Studies subjects (STM90655); and
- not have had any prior results for these subjects

5. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA, IN PRIORITY ORDER

- The prize will be awarded to the student who achieves the highest final result in the Communication Major MAJ10019 and the Global Studies Core subjects (STM90655).
- In the event more than one student scores the highest final result the prize will be given to the student with the highest overall GPA in the Bachelor of Global Studies Degree Program.

6. SELECTION

The prize will be recommended by the School of International Studies. The successful candidate will be approved by the Dean, Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences.

7. OTHER CONDITIONS

The recipient will send an acknowledgement to the donor upon receipt of the prize.

8. FUNDING

8.1 Internal Funding: Not applicable

8.2 External Funding: Group M has agreed to a 5-year commitment with the first prize to be awarded in 2017 for student achievement in 2016.

10. PUBLICATION OF CONDITIONS OF AWARD
