



UTS Prize Conditions of Award

Aqua Nine and DeAúrora UTS Good Manufacturing Practice Prize

Graduate School of Health

This document sets out the conditions of award for the below prize ('Prize') and the obligations of recipients ('Recipient') and UTS in regards to this Prize. The administrative processes to support awarding this Prize will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

1. PRIZE NAME: Aqua Nine and DeAúrora UTS Good Manufacturing Practice Prize

2. PURPOSE

The Aqua Nine and DeAúrora UTS Good Manufacturing Practice Prize was established to support a student commencing in the Master of Good Manufacturing Practice (C04301v2).

3. VALUE AND BENEFIT

3.1 Number of Recipients:

One (1) new Recipient will be awarded the prize each year commencing in 2021.

3.2 Benefit/s to Recipient:

- The maximum total value of the Prize is \$1,500 to each Recipient.

3.3 Payment of benefit/s:

- The Recipient will receive one payment of \$1,500 (or the pro-rata amount if part time study has been approved by exception) by electronic funds transfer to his/her nominated bank account.
- A certificate of award will be presented to each Recipient
- Payment will usually be made within four weeks after the Census date in Autumn session.

5. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for the Prize, an applicant must meet all of the following criteria:

- Commencing full-time student in the Master of Good Manufacturing Practice (C04301v2); and
- Must apply using the application form; and
- Must be available to attend an interview in person, if required.

6. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA

- Academic merit based on the GPA from the qualification used as the basis of admission into the Master of Good Manufacturing Practice (C04301v2).
- Motivation to succeed in the Master of Good Manufacturing Practice, as demonstrated in the application and interview.
- Articulated passion for career in GMP, as demonstrated in the application and interview.

7. SELECTION

Shortlisted candidates are interviewed and selected based on the above selection criteria as described in Clause 6. Eligible candidates will be presented to a Selection Committee, which will undertake the selection of Recipient.

The Committee will be made up of at least three relevant members of the UTS community, Chaired by the Head of Pharmacy (or their nominee) and GMP Course Coordinator (or their nominee). The Donor (or their

representatives) will be invited to sit on the committee. Offers will be authorised by the Chair of the Selection Committee.
