



UTS Conditions of Award

The Complementary Medicine Group (CMG) for Good Manufacturing Practice Prize

Graduate School of Health

This document sets out the conditions of award for the below prize ('Prize') and the obligations of recipients ('Recipient') and UTS in regards to this Prize. The administrative processes to support awarding this Prize will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

1. PRIZE NAME: The Complementary Medicine Group (CMG) for Good Manufacturing Practice Prize

2. PURPOSE

To recognise one student with the overall second highest mark in their 1st year of the Master of Good Manufacturing Practice (MGMP) program.

3. VALUE AND BENEFIT

3.1 Number of Recipients:

One (1) Recipient will be awarded the Prize annually.

3.2 Benefit to Recipient:

- The value of the Prize is \$2,000.
- The recipient will also receive a UTS Certificate of Award.

3.3 Payment of benefit:

- The Recipient will receive two payments of \$1000 by electronic funds transfer to their nominated bank account.
- A certificate of award will be presented to the Recipient(s)
- Payment will be made after the Census dates in Autumn and Spring sessions.
- Payments are subject to the Recipient(s) satisfying the ongoing eligibility criteria in line with the Scholarships and Prizes Policy and as outlined in clause 8 below.

4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The recipient must have

- been enrolled in the session prior to the selection of the prize
- Completed one (1) year of full time study of the Master of Good Manufacturing Practice (MGMP) Program

5. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA

- The Prize will go to the student who has achieved the overall calendar year 2nd highest mark in their 1st year of the Master of GMP (MGMP) program following the release of Spring Session results.
- In the event that two or more eligible students have the same highest 2nd final mark in the 1st year subjects, the following criteria will be considered:
 - Overall academic performance in the student's award course, including GPA, whether the student has failed other subjects, received academic cautions or had a finding of misconduct made against them.

6. SELECTION

- The student(s) with the 2nd highest final mark will be identified by GSH according to the eligibility and recipient selection criteria as provided in clause 4 and 5;
- In the event that two or more eligible students have the same 2nd highest final mark, a Selection Committee of a minimum of two (2) people, chaired by the Head, GSH (or nominee) will select a Recipient based on the specified selection criteria in clause 5; The endorsed Recipient will then be formally approved or declined by the Head, GSH (or nominee) based upon the selection criteria in clauses 5.

7. OTHER CONDITIONS
