 - .4 **that the Vice-Chancellor's intention to use the power conferred upon him by clause 47 of the University of Technology, Sydney By-law to make rules that address any drafting issues in the interim, be noted.**

1. Rule 7.5.2 (1) (b)

- Incorrect date for last day for deletion of a subject. Date has to be census date in order to align with CASS functionality.

Rule to read:

7.5.2 (1) (b) the last day for deletion of a subject is the ~~end of the fourth week of the~~
census date for the semester;

1. Rule 11.20.2 (1) (a)

- Reference to Rule 11.7 needs to be expanded for greater clarification
Rule to read:

11.20.2 The University may discontinue a student's candidature in a research course in certain circumstances including but not limited to:

(1) unsatisfactory progress

(a) where a student has not submitted a thesis for examination within the approved period of candidature (~~Rule 11.7~~) as specified in Rule 11.7 (refer Rule 11.10)

Changes to the Rules made since approval by Council on 14 February 2005

In accordance with By-law (Chapter 4, clause 47) I amend the Rules approved by Council on 14 February 2005 as follows (new text underlined, text deleted ~~struckthrough~~)

1. Rule 11.7.1

- Corrections to maximum time for period of candidature for doctoral degree which were submitted by UGSB but omitted in final version.

Rule to read:

11.7.1 The maximum ~~normal~~ time to complete a research degree is as follows:

- (1) Doctoral degree by research, professional Doctoral degree and Doctoral degree by creative works:
 - (a) four years ~~three years~~ for a full-time student; or
 - (b) six years ~~four and one half years~~ for a part-time student.

2. Rule 11.20.2 (1)

- incorrect rule referencing.

Rule to read:

- (1) unsatisfactory progress
 - (b) where a student has not satisfied progress requirements (Rule 11.13 ~~11.12~~)
 - (c) where a student has not satisfied candidature assessment requirements (Rule 11.14 ~~11.13~~)

3. Rule 16.6.3

- addition of the word 'serious' to maintain consistency with other rules in this Section.
- correction of typographical error in rule cross referencing.

Rule to read:

16.6.3 All other allegations of serious student misconduct must be referred to the Registrar and handled in accordance with rule ~~16.14~~ 16.15 below.

4. Rule 16.15.4

- incorrect text, which inadvertently limits the scope of this provision, is to be deleted.

Rule to read:

16.15.4 Where the alleged misconduct involves non-academic misconduct ~~during a centrally conducted examination~~, the Registrar will....
