## **UTS GENERAL RULES**

Schedule G1 — Delegations Principles

[...]

11. Delegations have been created with the University's organisation structure in mind. Delegations are therefore also held by a delegate's supervisor. If a delegate is unable to carry out the duties associated with his or her delegation for any reason, including a potential or actual conflict of interest or a temporary incapacity or absence, the delegation may be exercised by the delegate's supervisor. Delegations 1.10.2 and 1.11 to 1.13 operate in exception to this principle.
