The Cricketers



Lisa Sthalekar

Australian cricket commentator, and former cricketer and captain of the Australian women's national cricket team. Sthalekar was a right-handed all-rounder who bowled off-spin and was rated as the leading all-rounder in the world when rankings were introduced. Sthalekar is the first female cricketer to score 1000 runs and take 100 wickets in One Day Internationals



Matt Hayden

Australian cricket commentator, former international cricketer and coach. Hayden is widely considered to be one of the best opening batsmen in test cricket history. He also holds the record for the highest individual score by an Australian batsman, when he scored 380 against Zimbabwe during their 2003 tour of Australia.

Tim Harcourt is a UTS Industry Professor specialising in Australia's economic engagement with the global economy. He has worked in both public policy and research roles in international trade, labour markets, climate innovation and the economics of sport. He is the former Chief Economist of the Australian Trade Commission.

Meet the UTS Experts

James Brown is the Professor of Official Statistics at UTS in the School of Mathematical and Physical Sciences in the Faculty of Science. James applies statistical analysis within a wide range of fields, including health and healthcare, and disease and disease management, and is an internationally recognised expert in the field of population census coverage estimation.

Gerhard Hambusch is an Associate Professor of Finance in the Business School at UTS. His areas of expertise are corporate finance, responsible investment, and ethics and codes of conduct underpinning financial systems regulation within national and international frameworks.

Steven Langford is a Professor and the Head of School of Mathematical and Physical Sciences in the Faculty of Science. He is also a highly achieved organic chemist, using concepts from nature to build functional materials for diverse uses including in materials science, optoelectronics and medicinal chemistry.
