PANCREATIC CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

NOVEMBER 2022

November was Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month, an important time for pancreatic cancer researchers and supporters alike. We started the month off with a social media campaign on Instagram and Facebook, sharing posts about pancreatic cancer, signs and symptoms, risk factors and importantly, PERT. Across the two sites, we had positive engagement from other pancreatic cancer awareness organisations, as well as people living with pancreatic cancer and their families.
