RE: Theft of bicycles in Sydney City Local Area Command (LAC)



There has been a recent increase in the number of pushbikes stolen in the Sydney City area. This has been an ongoing issue across Sydney, however, the spike in occurrences means that offenders are becoming more confident and taking advantage of every opportunity they can.

Alarmingly, thefts are also occurring within common areas of residential properties. This may include secure parking facilities, foyers and corridors. Although apartment blocks are private spaces for residents and tenants, it is quite possible for thieves to enter the premises without drawing attention to themselves.

Police are urging all pushbike owners and users to take the following precautions:

- Store your bike inside your own house/ unit. If living with others, keep it in your room.
- If it must be stored in a place accessible to others, secure it with multiple HIGH QUALITY bike locks that cannot be cut apart. The lock unit(s) should be tethered to a permanent fixture that cannot be broken.
- ALWAYS lock your bicycle to a strong fixture when leaving it in public. Even a one- minute dash into a shop is all the time a thief needs.
- Engrave your bike with some identifying information. This could be your Driver's Licence number (e.g. NSW 12345678) or name and date of birth. Put your contact details on an obvious location on your bike. Should it be found or recovered, Police can guickly identify the owner and contact them.
- Each bicycle has a unique serial number etched onto it. It should also be printed on the documentation that comes with the bike at purchase. If you cannot locate it, contact the manufacturer or retailer/ previous owner the bike was purchased from.
- Record the following details of your bike and keep it in a safe place. This can be used to prove an owner of a recovered bike. You may use the table below:
