

UTS Prize Conditions of Award

CPA Australia Prize – Top Second Year Student

Faculty: UTS BUSINESS SCHOOL

This document sets out the conditions of award for the below prize ('Prize') and the obligations of recipients ('Recipient') and UTS in regards to this Prize. The administrative processes to support awarding this Prize will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

1. PRIZE NAME: CPA Australia Prize – Top Second Year Student

2. PURPOSE

The Prize, a gift made between CPA Australia and UTS, sets out to encourage students to aspire to academic excellence.

3. VALUE AND BENEFIT

3.1 Number of Recipients:

One (1) Recipient will be awarded the Prize at the end of each academic year that the subjects 22420 Accounting Standards and Regulations, 22321 Cost Management Systems, and 22320 Accounting for Business Combinations are offered.

3.2 Benefit/s to Recipient:

The value of the Prize to the Recipient is \$1,000. They will also receive a Certificate of Award.

3.3 Payment of benefit/s:

- The Recipient will receive one payment of \$1,000 by cheque, to be given at the UTS Business School prize-giving event, commencing in June 2018.
- A certificate of award will be presented to the Recipient at the UTS Business School prize-giving event.

4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The Recipient must have been:

- a full-time or part-time student immediately prior to the selection of the Prize; and
- enrolled in and received a result in the subject Accounting for Business Combinations in the year for which the award is made, and
- enrolled in and received a result in the subject 22420 Accounting Standards and Regulations in the same or the prior year, and
- enrolled in and received a result in the subject 22321 Cost Management Systems in the same or the prior year.

5. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA, IN PRIORITY ORDER

- The highest aggregate mark awarded for the subjects 22420 Accounting Standards and Regulations, 22321 Cost Management Systems, and 22320 Accounting for Business Combinations
- In the event two or more eligible students have the same highest WAM the following will be considered:
 - The highest overall WAM for the entire degree to date;
 - No previous attempts of the subjects.

6. SELECTION

The Recipient will be nominated by the UTS Business School Faculty Board as per Clause 5, and approved by the Dean (or nominee).

7. OTHER CONDITIONS

Should UTS find itself unable to award this prize in any given year, UTS will consult with CPA Australia to amend the selection criteria (temporarily or, if agreed, permanently) to enable the allocation of the prize on the closest possible basis in accordance with CPA Australia's original intentions.
