

# UTS Prize Conditions of Award

## King & Wood Mallesons Prize

### Faculty: Law

This document sets out the conditions of award for the below prize ('Prize') and the obligations of recipients ('Recipient') and UTS in regards to this Prize. The administrative processes to support awarding this Prize will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

#### **1. PRIZE NAME: King & Wood Mallesons Prize**

#### **2. PURPOSE**

To recognise the best performing student who has completed his or her core Law subjects in the academic year for which the prize is given.

#### **3. VALUE AND BENEFIT**

**3.1 Number of Recipients:** Usually one (1) recipient will be awarded the Prize at the end of each academic year.

#### **3.2 Benefit/s to Recipient:**

The value of the Prize to the Recipient is \$1,500. The recipient will also receive a certificate of award.

#### **3.3 Payment of benefit/s:**

- The Recipient will receive one payment of \$1,500; and
- A certificate of award will be presented to the Recipient at the annual UTS Faculty of Law Awards Ceremony. If the Recipient is unable to attend the Ceremony, alternative arrangements will be made.

#### **4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

In order to be eligible, the student must meet the following criteria:

- Be enrolled in an LLB, combined LLB degree or Juris Doctor; and
- Have completed all core subjects in his or her respective degree in the academic year for which the prize is being awarded (STM90832 Core (Law) or STM90688 Core subjects or STM90831 Core subjects (JD) or equivalents as amended from time to time).

#### **5. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA**

- The Prize will be awarded to an eligible student with the highest Weighted Average Mark (WAM).
- In the event that two or more eligible students have the same WAM, the following criteria will be considered:
  - Overall academic performance, including whether the student has failed any subjects, received any academic cautions and rate of progression;
  - Whether any findings of misconduct have been made against the student;
  - Any other valuable contributions made by the student to the Faculty outside of academic achievement.

#### **6. SELECTION**

- The proposed Recipient with the highest WAM will be identified by Progressions, Results & Conferral (SAU) according to the eligibility and recipient selection criteria as provided in clauses 4 and 5;
- In the event that two or more eligible students have the same highest final mark, a selection committee of a minimum of two (2) people will select a Recipient based on the specified selection criteria in clause 5;

- The proposed Recipient will then be formally approved or declined by Faculty of Law Academic Board based upon the selection criteria in clauses 5 and 7.

#### **7. OTHER CONDITIONS**

The Faculty of Law Academic Board may decline to offer the award to a Recipient who achieves the highest WAM where the WAM is less than 75.
