

UTS Prize Conditions of Award

PMI Project Management Student Prize

Faculty: Design, Architecture Building (DAB)

This document sets out the conditions of award for the below prize ('Prize') and the obligations of recipients ('Recipient') and UTS in regards to this Prize. The administrative processes to support awarding this Prize will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

1. PRIZE NAME: PMI Project Management Prize

2. PURPOSE

To encourage academic excellence in students undertaking postgraduate Project Management courses.

3. VALUE AND BENEFIT

3.1 Number of Recipients:

- Usually one (1) recipient will be awarded the Prize in each calendar year provided there is a student of sufficient merit.
- In cases where more than one student achieves a sufficient mark, the student with the highest overall GPA in their course will be awarded the Prize.

3.2 Benefit/s to Recipient:

- The value of the Prize to the Recipient is \$500.
- The Recipient will also receive a certificate of award.

3.3 Payment of benefit/s:

- The Recipient will receive one payment of \$500.00 by electronic funds transfer to his/her nominated bank account.
- A certificate of award will be presented to the Recipient by the donor or the donor's representative at the DAB prize giving event.

4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for the Prize, a candidate must meet all of the following criteria:

- Be enrolled in either the:
 - Master of Project Management Course (C04006); or the
 - Graduate Certificate in Project Management (C11005); and
- As part of this course, have successfully completed the four (4) core Project Management subjects, 15310 Scope and Integration Management, 15312 Project Communication, HR and Stakeholders, 15316 Project Time and Cost Management and 15319 Project Risk, Procurement and Quality Management.

5. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA, IN PRIORITY ORDER

- The prize will be awarded to the student who, in the year for which the award is made, has obtained the highest Weighted Average Mark (WAM) over the four (4) Project Management subjects.
 - 15310 Scope and Integration Management
 - 15312 Project Communication, HR and Stakeholders
 - 15316 Project Time and Cost Management
 - 15319 Project Risk, Procurement and Quality Management
- Where two (2) or more students achieve the same WAM, the student (1) with the highest overall Grade Point Average (GPA) in their course will be awarded the Prize.

6. SELECTION

- The prize recipient will be selected by the Faculty of Design, Architecture and Building.
- No selection committee is required to confirm the highest WAM and/or overall GPA.
- The highest WAM and/or overall GPA is obtained from DAB Academic Programs Office.
- The recipient will be approved by the Dean of the Faculty of DAB.
