

UTS Prize Conditions of Award

Narelle Smith Memorial Prize

Faculty: Science

This document sets out the conditions of award for the below prize ('Prize') and the obligations of recipients ('Recipient') and UTS in regards to this Prize. The administrative processes to support awarding this Prize will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

1. PRIZE NAME: Narelle Smith Memorial Prize

2. PURPOSE:

This prize was established in 2016 in memory of Narelle Faye Smith, who joined the University of Technology, Sydney in 1992 and was Leader (Teaching and Learning) in the School of Mathematical Sciences at the time of her death in November 2012. It is awarded each year for the best performance by a student in the subject 37253 Sample Surveys in the preceding year.

3. VALUE AND BENEFIT

3.1 Number of Recipients:

- One Recipient will be awarded the Prize at the end of each year that the subject 37253 Sample Surveys is offered.

3.2 Benefit/s to Recipient:

- The Recipient will receive \$500.

3.3 Payment of benefit/s:

- The Recipient will receive one payment of \$500 by electronic funds transfer to his/her nominated bank account.
- A certificate of award will be presented to the Recipient at the Faculty of Science prize giving event.

4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- The recipient must be enrolled in and receive a result in the subject 37253 Sample Surveys in the year immediately prior to the selection of the Prize
- The recipient must not have received a result for any previous attempt in this subject.
- The result achieved must be a minimum of 75D.

5. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA:

- The Prize will be awarded to the student that receives the highest final mark in the subject in the relevant year.
- In the event that two or more eligible students have the same highest final mark, the following criteria will be considered:
 - a) Performance in subject 37253 Sample Surveys outside of formal assessment that demonstrates mastery of and engagement in the subject;
 - b) Overall academic performance in the student's award course, including GPA, whether the student has failed other subjects, received academic cautions or had a finding of misconduct made against them.

6. SELECTION:

- The Recipient with the highest final mark will be identified according to the eligibility and recipient selection criteria as provided in clauses 4 and 5;

- In the event that two or more eligible students have the same highest final mark, a selection committee of a minimum of two (2) people will select a recipient based on the specified selection criteria in clause 5;
- The nominated Recipient will then be formally approved or declined by Faculty of Science based upon the selection criteria in clauses 5 and 7.

7. OTHER CONDITIONS:

The Faculty of Science may decline to offer the award to a Recipient whose achieves the highest final mark where the mark is less than 75.
