

## **UTS Prize Conditions of Award**

# **Pharmaceutical Defence Limited Prize**

## **Graduate School of Health**

This document sets out the conditions of award for the below prize ('Prize') and the obligations of recipients ('Recipient') and UTS in regards to this Prize. The administrative processes to support awarding this Prize will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

### 1. PRIZE NAME: Pharmaceutical Defence Limited Prize

#### 2. PURPOSE

To recognise and encourage the achievements of high-performing UTS Master of Pharmacy students in the area of professional services.

### 3. VALUE AND BENEFIT

## 3.1 Number of Recipients:

Two (2) Recipients will be awarded the Prize annually, one from each year level.

## 3.2 Benefit to Recipient:

- The value of the Prize to each Recipient is \$500.
- Each Recipient will also receive a certificate of award.

## 3.3 Payment of benefit:

- Each recipient will receive one payment of \$500 by electronic funds transfer to their nominated Australian bank account.
- A certificate of award will be presented to each Recipient at the annual School of Pharmacy Gala Dinner.

## 4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The Recipients must:

- be enrolled in the UTS Master of Pharmacy (Coursework); and
- have successfully completed:
  - o Professional Services 1 (96004) (first year student) or
  - o Professional Services 3 (96009) (second year student)

in the semester immediately prior to award of the Prize; and

- be enrolled in:
  - o Professional Services 2 (96005) (first year student) or
  - o Professional Services 4 (96012) (second year student)

at the time of award.

### **5. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA**

- The first year Prize will be awarded to the student who has received the highest cumulative mark in the subjects Professional Services 1 (96004) and Professional Services 2 (96005) at the time of award of the Prize.
- In the event that two or more eligible students have the same highest final mark, the following criteria will be considered:
  - o Highest overall mark in Professional Services 1 (96004)
  - Overall academic performance in the student's award course, including GPA, whether the student has failed other subjects, received academic cautions or had a finding of misconduct made against them.
- The second year Prize will be awarded to the student who has received the highest cumulative mark in the subjects Professional Services 3 (96009) and Professional Services 4 (96012) at the time of award of the Prize.
- In the event that two or more eligible students have the same highest final mark, the following criteria will be considered:
  - o Highest overall mark in Professional Services 3 (96009)
  - Overall academic performance in the student's award course, including GPA, whether the student has failed other subjects, received academic cautions or had a finding of misconduct made against them.

## 6. SELECTION

- The students with the highest cumulative mark will be selected by the Graduate School of Health. The selection will take place prior to the annual School of Pharmacy Gala Dinner.
- The endorsed Recipient will then be formally approved or declined by the Head, Graduate School of Health (or nominee) based upon the selection criteria in clause 5.
