

UTS Prize Conditions of Award UTS Insearch International Student Prize in Business

Faculty: UTS BUSINESS SCHOOL

This document sets out the conditions of award for the below Prize and the obligations of the Recipient and UTS in regards to this Prize. The administrative processes to support awarding this Prize will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

1. PRIZE NAME: UTS Insearch International Student Prize in Business

2. PURPOSE

The Prize a gift made between UTS Business School and UTS Insearch to encourage academic excellence by an international undergraduate student in the Bachelor of Business.

3. VALUE AND BENEFIT

3.1 Number of Recipients:

One (1) Recipient will be awarded the Prize at the end of each academic year the Bachelor of Business is offered.

3.2 Benefit/s to Recipient:

- The value of the prize to the Recipient is \$1,000.
- The Recipient will also receive a UTS Certificate of Award.

3.3 Payment of benefit/s:

- The Recipient will receive one payment of \$1,000 by cheque to be given at the UTS Business School prize giving event.
- The Certificate of Award will be presented to the Recipient at the UTS Business School prize giving event.

4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The Recipient must have:

- 1. Completed a Diploma in Business at UTS Insearch
- 2. Been registered as an international student in the following course in the year for which the award is made:
 - Bachelor of Business
- 3. Completed a course and the following major in the year for which the award is made:
 - o Any major with the exception of International Business or Accounting.

5. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA, IN PRIORITY ORDER

- The Recipient must have obtained the highest Weighted Average Mark (WAM) for all major subjects of all students satisfying clause 4. above.
- In the event that two or more eligible students have the highest WAM, the following criteria will be considered:
 - The highest overall WAM in the Bachelor of Business.

6. SELECTION

The Recipient will be nominated by the UTS Business School Faculty Board as per Clause 5.

7. OTHER CONDITIONS The UTS Business School may decline to offer the award to a Recipient who achieves the weighted average mark where the mark is less than 75.
